SCHOOL VIOLENCE/ SAFE & DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS REPORT

Title IV funding, which supported the Safe and Drug-Free Schools initiative, ended at the conclusion of the 2009-2010 school year. A yearly practice as a part of that program has been to conduct a survey of significant groups associated with the schools to assess the impact of the Safe and Drug-Free program. This annual survey was conducted in the spring of 2014. The groups who participated in the survey included students, teachers, building administrators, and parents. A copy of the survey with the results is available.

Expenditures from local funds target the safety of students, both in the area of drug use prevention and in violence prevention. These concepts have been supported and enhanced by professional development experiences for teachers. The Safe and Drug-Free activities have included parents and the community, resulting in a heightened awareness and participation in KISD's Safe and Drug-Free programs.

Sample resources include:

- Anger management materials and;
- Professional development presentations including bully prevention training, the *Yello Dyno* safety program, the addiction cycle, self-harm concerns, diversity issues, cyber bullying, gangs;
- Materials for Peer Mediation training and mentoring programs and Getting Along activities;
- Attendance at the *Intermediate Leadership Conference* which empowers students to be leaders on their campus by designing a safe school.
- Attendance at the *Red Ribbon Boat Ride Event* which empowers students to be leaders on their campus and share the dangers of drug use with their fellow students.
